LAE ROADS

Two weeks ago we reported that the LCCI arranged a meeting between Department of Works (DoW) and four of the contractors on the Lae City Roads Rehabilitation Project (LCRRP), who have not been paid for work performed on the roads. Subsequently we have been advised that as a result of this meeting, an interim payment was made to the contractors so they could at least pay salaries and some of their creditors. DoW is now working on a submission for the remaining outstanding claims from the road contractors to be paid.

The next thing that DoW will have to do is to seek funding to finish off the contracts that have stalled. Our fears are that if the roads are left the way they are, all the preparation work will be ruined in the now upon us rainy season.

CRIME

There is no doubt that crime is on a spiral in Lae at the moment. There are a number of reasons for this:

- The elections are to be held next month, which always brings many people to Lae, as the elections will be held in Lae first before other rural Morobe areas, and the Highlands Provinces. People are lured to Lae during the elections for various reasons, and often turn to crime so they can get to their home areas.
- The Police are undermanned at the moment and during the actual elections the Police will be occupied with securing the elections and election personnel and ballot papers.
- The current challenge to the constitution and the recent political quarrelling over when the elections are to be held, have been unsettling to the public.
- The unfinished cement roads are stopping the normal free flow of traffic and criminals take advantage of the situation.

You will have seen the gruesome photo in today's newspapers, of the 'raskol' killed by the police at five mile yesterday. The notorious 'miles' area is very active again, where at any time day or night, a criminal gang will jump in front of unsuspecting vehicles, usually armed with homemade guns and any weapon they can lay their hands on. These gangs are now operating on the streets of Lae City, mostly during the day and late afternoon.

Therefore we advise drivers to be very alert when driving around Lae and the nearby environs. Stay on the main roads as much as possible; lock all doors when driving around; be on your guard when stuck in traffic jams or behind slow moving vehicles; ensure your doors are locked when you are parking and beware of groups of people lingering in driveways or on streets.
