FROM THE PRESIDENTS DESK

ELECTIONS

The 2012 elections POLLING SCHEDULES for the **Lae Urban Area** that we published in the News Update last week have now been posted to our website. If you missed getting your copy or want to refer to these schedules please visit our website at www.lcci.org.pg.

There is a lot of confusion as to the actual Polling date for Lae. Whilst polling starts throughout the nation on Saturday 23^{rd} June 2012, the actual Polling day for the Lae Urban elections will be held only on -

Tuesday 26th June 2012.

The Polling hours will be from **8 AM to 6 PM**.

The Lae Urban areas include voting for the three open electorates:

- 1. Lae
- 2. Nawae Malahang and Bumayong areas
- 3. Huon extends as far as 11 mile and Awilunga Estate

The Electoral Commission has requested that Companies allow staff time off to perform their voting duties on the polling day of Tuesday June 26th, and suggest either the full morning or afternoon be allowed for this.

YOUR SECURITY DURING THE ELECTIONS

Joint action by both the Royal Papua New Guinea Constabulary and the PNG Defence Force during the elections should be able to handle the elections and election related incidences in Lae City. The Police with the extra Defence Force personnel will be in a good position to keep Lae as peaceful as possible during the election period.

As the elections in the Lae Urban area will be held over one day only, and with the beefed up security, we do not expect any large scale election related issues. As normal there will likely be squabbles between candidates and their supporters, but the Police should be able to contain these, and control major out-breaks if they occur.

We will continue to meet with the Police to get an update on their action and any reported problems and we will advise members accordingly.

MOROBE PROVINCIAL PHYSICAL PLANNING BOARD (MPPPB)

About 15 years ago, Morobe Province was the first Province to obtain a full Provincial Physical Planning Board, after 5 years of successfully operating a Physical Planning Advisory Committee. This was a very positive step, as Lae City was starting to expand and it was too cumbersome to send all planning matters to the National Physical Planning Board in Port Moresby. The MPPPB was very effective and made some difficult but good rulings and set in place some excellent Policies.


In 2009 the membership of the MPPB was changed with the appointment of an irregular Chairman, as well as a non-Chamber member to the reserved Chamber position. Several appeals by the LCCI to the Governor and the Provincial Executive Council fell on deaf ears, even though our case was supported in writing by the Chief Physical Planner (CPP).

Eventually after some very dubious decisions, the Minister for Lands and Physical Planning suspended the MPPPB in October last year. Since the suspension all planning matters have been referred to the National Physical Planning Board, which clogs up the National Board and delays decisions on Morobe Provincial matters. The suspension has remained in place as the MPG has ignored several requests by the CPP to resolve the differences over the structure of the MPPPB.

This week a meeting was held with all stakeholders in attendance. The Chief Physical Planner had travelled to Lae to specifically state his willingness to delegate his powers to a Committee of appropriate appointees, for all planning matters affecting Lae Urban area and the Morobe Province. A resolution was made to send a letter to the Chief Physical Planner naming the committee representatives and formally requesting his delegation of physical planning powers. It was acknowledged that this committee was only an interim one with advisory powers but the establishment was welcomed as it will keep all local Physical Planning matters within the Province, until the full board is re-established.

The CPP also highlighted the need to revise the Lae Urban Development plan, to take into consideration the recent developments and future expansion plans, especially in the Nadzab development corridor area. The CPP tasked the newly formed committee to commence formulating this Plan.




