Page 27 of today's Post Courier carried the following story:

Link to be a revolution to communication sector

THERE will be an enormous improvement in telecommunications sector, particularly the internet access speeds and mobile phone communications.

This was made possible after the completion of the Lae-Madang optic fibre telecommunications link.

Outgoing Minister for Public Enterprise Sir Mekere Morauta said this last night in a statement to mark the completion of the linking of the optic fibre cable.

"The activation of this cable is part of a transformation of the social and economic landscape of Papua New Guinea's telecommunications revolution.

"Much of what is happening is a result of some visionary work done by my Government between 1999 and 2002.

'My decision to introduce competition into the telecommunications sector opened the door to Digicel, and that one decision has changed our world forever.

"The take-up of mobile phones and internet services since then has revolutionised our personal and business interactions

He said in August last year, the O'Neill- Namah Govern-ment identified this project as a priority and the IPBC Board approved the funding.

"At K5.6 million, the project is not big, but its impact will be very significant indeed.

"It fills in what is known as the "missing link" in our telecommunications system between here and Madang, where the international submarine cable comes ashore.

"A uses an existing PNG Power optical fibre built to support the Ramu electricity transmission system. It involved installing various pieces of power and telecommunications equipment and constructing support facilities along the route

"Providing the link will allow the expansion of highspeed internet, data and voice services to private and corporate customers across the na-

"It will also allow Telikom to go ahead with overdue repairs to the APNG international submarine telecommunications cable, which has been operating at 50 per cent capacity for some time.

'And most importantly for the future, the optical fibre link will form part of the National Transmission Network, which IPBC recently began work on," Sir Mekere said

He said revamping the natelecommunications tional network will make a significant contribution to national economic development and

to improved delivery of services, especially to rural and remote areas.

Meanwhile he said so many reforms could have been done over the last decade rather than being blocked or thrown out by the Somare regime.

"In the past 10 years little of significance has been undertaken to repair and extend our national physical and economic infrastructure.
"Our Public Enterprises,

charged with delivering some of our most important services, have been left under-funded and without policy direction; they have been abused and manipulated for political purposes, and they have been treated as a personal fiefdom.

"They have lacked the skills, the political leadership and the capital to make serious progress on providing affordable, reliable and effective services to the people.

Late last year Telikom advised the LCCI that it would have an Optic Fibre connection with Madang to link to the sub-sea cable system (PPC-1 PIPE) by June this year. Well here we are the 20th July and the launch of this service was made today, as referred to in the above article. We are grateful to Telikom that they were able to have this system available in a timely manner.

Telikom said that the OPGW cable can handle internet speeds of up to 5 MB per second. Internet at this speed will revolutionise the way businesses conduct their operations in Lae.

Telikom were to have sent me an information pack with details of how and where to apply for this service, what costs and charges are involved, what equipment is required (if different from current equipment) and anything else that is needed. Unfortunately at the time of publishing this newsletter, this information had not come through, which is understandable as all Telikom media staff were tied up in today's launching. As soon as this information is available, I will circulate it for members use.

IPA HAVE A NEW ONLINE BUSINESS REGISTRATION SERVICE

INVESTMENT PROMOTION AUTHORITY

You will have seen the following article in the newspapers this week, promoting the new Company ONLINE service for Business Registration, Company checks and Annual Returns. This system will speed up the time to start up businesses and allow you quick access to company information. More information can be obtained from the IPA website – www.ipa.gov.pg.

The website can also be used to download a range of Business Forms and to obtain a wide range of information on business opportunities, investment advice and restrictions etc.

Business application lodgment go online

ASPIRING Papua New Guineans who have wished to venture into business but been denied by non availability of business registration office or centers will now register their business and company even from their bedroom.

bedroom.

This is made possible by the Investment Promotion Authority (IPA) through the Central Supply Tenders Board which has signed a contract with New Zealand-based Company, Foster Moore Limited (FML), to supply new online perjistration software

(FML), to supply new online registration software.

This initiative will take IPA a step closer to rolling out an electronic business registry that will make business start-up easier for entrepreneurs and business owners in the near future.

The initiative is part of a broader effort by the IPA to introduce reforms and tools to improve the business environment so businesses can expand.

The IPA is implementing these reforms in consultation with the PNG business community.

Under the contract, FML will replace the current system used by the IPA with online lodgment compatible software, which it will license to the IPA.

"This company was chosen as they possess the resources, capabilities and expertise to deliver a secure system for the PNG business environment" said Ivan Pomaleu, IPA Managing

Director. "The company has numerous clients including the New Zealand Companies Office and various other public registries in the Pacific."

International Finance Corporation (IFC), a member of the World Bank Group, is supporting the IPA's program to simplify business registration and will assist IPA staff with training on the new system.

"Once the system is launched, customers will be able to register and lodge documents online," said Carolyn Blacklock, IFC's Resident Representative in PNG.

"This will cut registration time and make the process more accessible, encouraging business start-up, particularly for those operating in remote areas."

Today most customers register in person at the IPA Port Moresby based office or use the postal service or an agent especially in the other centers of PNG.

Accessing data on firms in PNG will also be easier once the new system is rolled out.

The IPA houses the Companies Office, which holds the Company Registry information. Plans Include transferring this information online, which will allow people to check company records, such as the names of directors, before they sign a contract or lend money to a company

The Lae wet has well and truly set in and the sections that had been prepared for the laying of concrete, but left due to lack of funds, have all but collapsed and will most likely have to be prepared from scratch again. This is the real shame about the disorganized approach of the Lae Roads Rehabilitation project – which has delivered a potentially better road system in Lae, but one that was not completed due to over spending on the initial contracts and improper management of the project.
