



Soroptimist International Lae, is a service organization made up more than 30 professional women and girls. Soroptimist International has 3 clubs in Papua New Guinea and also operates in another 125 countries with more than 100,000 members in the world. Here in Lae, Soroptimist International raise awareness on key development issues and raises funding which supports PNG Cancer Relief Society, Well Women's Clinic, Morobe Special Education Resource Centre, Haus Claire Orphanage, disasters and many more.

This year and for the next five years Soroptimist International Lae, will be working on a Village Birth Attendants Intervention Project, to be conducted in remote rural areas of the 3 Local Level Government in Huon District of Morobe Province. The goal of the project is to re-improve infant and maternal health by providing VBA technical trainings to Village Birth Attendances who will be assisting a pregnant mother to safely deliver a baby successfully in the most rural villages/wards of this district.

Under this VBA project, Soroptimist International of Lae is conducting a campaign called the "Save a Mother-Save a Baby-Save a Family" which was also circulated out in the Lae Chamber of Commerce Newsletter Volume: 21-12. Our aim is to mobilize 3,000 mother & Baby Care Kits
