# FROM THE PRESIDENTS DESK NATIONAL ELECTION RESULTS

The member for Pangia the Honourable Peter O'Neill was elected the Prime Minister of Papua New Guinea shortly before 3 PM this afternoon, with an overwhelming vote 94 in favour 12 against. At the time of writing this, Mr. O'Neill was on his way to Government House to be sworn in as Prime Minister. The earlier swearing in of the speaker by the Governor General paved the way for the nomination and election of the Prime Minister. By early next week (hopefully Monday) we should see who has been appointed the Deputy Prime Minister and the new Cabinet Members.

We offer our congratulations to Mr. Peter O'Neill on becoming Prime Minister.

The Member for Finschhafen the Honourable Theodore Zurenuoc is the new Speaker of the National Parliament polling 88 votes to 17. This will mean that Mr. Zurenuoc must resign as deputy leader of the Peoples Progress Party. It is however pleasing that a member from Morobe Province has secured this esteemed position. Our congratulations are extended to the Member for Finschhafen.

It appears that the country may have three female members of Parliament, when the Triumph Heritage Empowerment Party candidate Julie Soso is the duly elected member for the Eastern Highlands Provincial seat. Unfortunately as we write this, disputes are delaying the declaration of Julie but if these matters are sorted out, she will then become the first Female Governor in Papua New Guinea (unless she is given a ministerial portfolio). This will be a great achievement



# Lae Roads Report

# Lae roads

The newly elected Prime Minister Peter O'Neill is a great supporter of the rehabilitation of the Lae Roads. As we mentioned last week that some of the contractors have started to work on the halted Lae roads projects again which is very pleasing indeed. We are sure that Mr. O'Neill will be able to counter any doubt about the necessity of continuing the funding to allow the completion of the Lae Roads Rehabilitation Project.

The LCCI will try to obtain regular information on the progress of the roads works again so we can advise our members, and avoid confusion and increasing traffic problems.

With the rainy season coming to an end soon, now is the right time to re-start the work on the Lae Roads, so that there is hopefully going to be plenty of time available to complete the roads before next year's wet. The amount of traffic that is now on the Lae roads is just enormous and we deserve good roads to cope with this increase, so that a good flow can be maintained.

Mr. O'Neill was also responsible for the allocation of K5 million to allow the upgrading of the road into NADZAB airport, from the Highlands Highway. After a quick start by grading this stretch of road last year, no further work has transpired. We trust that the work will recommence on this very heavily travelled road.
