FROM THE PRESIDENTS DESK

The Christmas function was held at the Huon Club on Wednesday and over 60 people were in attendance. All enjoyed themselves over a few drinks and snacks.

It is a good opportunity for the members to network with others in similar positions to discuss a wide range of issues, not in the least the way business is operated in Lae and the difficulties that we all face.

It was really great to see Hans and Thea Mehl at this function, and to hear the stories of their horrible ordeal at the hands of a ruthless group of thugs in the early hours of Sunday. Thea put together a few words of appreciation for the support that they have received from the business community -

Would you be able to put in the newsletter that we thank everyone for their best wishes, support and help. It has made a lot of difference to us and has helped us to keep on going.

To-day is Hans' birthday and we thank the lord he made this one, it could have been so different.

Our son Leon has arrived which is terrific too especially as Air Niugini made extra effort to find him a seat as early as possible.

Today's newspaper refers to 200 consultants to be made available by the Australian Government to assist with the operation of 89 Districts. Sir Puk Temu stated that, "Building capacity does not come in one day but comes over time but what we have secured in this Forum (Australia – PNG Ministerial Forum) is for core funded positions like district administrators and district treasurers to be filled so we can co-fund the program – the PNG Government to pay base salary and the Australian government to pay other allowances".

The editorial in the Post Courier wrongly declared that the Australian Government will be putting Kiaps into 89 districts. I really don't think this is what is going to be attempted and that it is probably a loose interpretation by the newspaper.

The old Kiap system really worked very well pre Independence as it was basically a cheap and effective means of administering and delivering services in the Districts and the rural areas in particular from what was in those days a very scant budgetary allocation. It is doubtful that the system could be reintroduced.

I believe that what the Australian Government really wants to do is to assist to establish proper controls in the district for a more effective management and service delivery system in the districts. To do this they will deploy officers with the appropriate skills to affect the controls and train the PNG counterparts on how to do it properly. This will be a difficult task and I don't envy these officers in the job they will take on, as they will need to change the bad habits that have developed since Independence, in all the public service not only at the District level.



MARKHAM ROAD (Cont) - CHAMBERS COMMENT


We have pointed out to the road contractors that it was unnecessary to cut down all the rain trees that once beautified this section of Markham Road. EW engineers claim that they only followed instructions from the supervising engineers (DOW) due to obstructions for road safety and long lasting construction. EW has agreed that new trees will be planted for road beautification

This is a bit of a cop out as it was easier to lop all the trees than the ones that may have caused a problem. We have made out position clear on this for the future, but unfortunately the trees are gone. We want to be told about future destruction of the trees. Also we have asked about what type of trees are going to replace the ones that were removed.

We also consider one month closure for the construction and sealing of this section as being too long as the seal will be in bitumen and so there is no time needed to cure the surface.

We do however appreciate the Traffic Management notice and look forward to receiving these in future.
