Kamkumung Bridge to be closed

PUBLIC NOTICE

THIS NOTICE SERVES TO ADVISE THE TRAVELLING PUBLIC OF LAE CITY THAT BUMBU BRIDGE WILL BE CLOSED FOR ROAD CONSTRUCTION.

THE BRIDGE WILL BE CLOSED FOR AN APPROXIMATE PERIOD OF ONE (1) MONTH COMMENCING SUNDAY, 2ND FEBRUARY, 2014.

THE NOMINATED ROUTE FOR ALL AFFECTED COMMUTORS SHALL BE THROUGH BUTIBAM ROAD.

MOTORISTS ARE ADVISED TO ADHERE TO AND BE SENSITIVE TO THE SPEED LIMITS THROUGH THE BUTIBAM VILLAGE.

THE MANAGEMENT OF FTM CONSTRUCTION LIMITED WOULD LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO APOLOGISE FOR ANY INCONVENIENCES CAUSED DURING THE BRIDGE CLOSURE.

FTM Construction Limited in this adjoining notice has taken steps to address most of the concerns expressed by Lae Chamber of Commerce last week. The Company's Civil Engineer notified the Chamber that they have made temporary repairs to the Butibum Road, so that the extra volume of traffic will be able to flow better when the Kamkumung Bridge is closed. Also arrangements have been made to conduct appropriate awareness to the villagers, about safety and speeding aspects. A number of Butibum people were quite agitated by the fact that the plans to close the bridge and open the Butibum road to all the traffic, was being done without their knowledge. Our advice is for these discussions to be conducted without any deferral so that there won't be any further delays to the project. After all the closure of the bridge is to allow for the construction of a good quality road, which is in the best interests of the whole of Lae.

The FTM Civil Engineer said that even though bridge will be closed from Sunday, it will be opened at night for a few days until the cement is actually laid. So the schedule is:

- Sunday, 2nd February, 2014 Tuesday, 4th February, 2014: Bridge Closure between 0900hrs 1600hrs:
- Wednesday, 5th February, 2014: Bridge Full closure commencing 0900hrs (date tentative to approval on completed base preparations on road).
- Bridge to remain closed for the curing duration of the concrete slabs (about 28 days).

The use of Airways Avenue, as a diversion for traffic from the Busu/Markham Road junction that is blocked due to Road work by Shorncliffe, has caused huge problems. The traffic volume and the weights of some of the loads, has severely damaged the bypass road and caused more than just disruption to traffic. Because this road was not built to handle this type or volume of traffic, the road has been severely damaged. Hence trucks have run off the road, become stuck in the road and dragged down electricity and television lines (see adjoining photo). Residences have been more than inconvenienced, as they had no power for days following. Of course the idiot drivers particularly those on PMV buses, who consider this road a speed track don't help matters. Shorncliffe have put in a considerable amount of fill to alleviate the problem but the real cause is that the road was not maintained to a standard to put up with this traffic load. Now it will be very costly to return the road to a good usable state, when the road work is complete.

RECENT FIRES LINKED TO POWER PROBLEMS

Fires Due to Electrical Causes

Due to the recent incidence of warehouse / wholesale building fires, which will probably be blamed on electrical wiring faults, I have been prompted to offer the following report.

Preventive Procedures

1. Bad Earthing

Can be detected by comprehensive continuity testing

 Electrical Thermal 'Hot Spots' These are created by –

a) Under sizing of electrical cables, switchboards and existing equipment

Commonly caused by occupier 'adding on' building extensions and additional equipment to an existing installation, thus overloading existing electrical infra structure

The 'overloading' can result in incoming cables becoming too small for applied new load, existing change-over switches being rated below actual load applied, and switchboards becoming overloaded and overheated.

All of above can be detected by infra-red imaging, and regular load testing.

b) Bad connections

Usually the result of overloading, bad connections from initial crimping, cable 'nestling' within a connection, causing a loose connection and arcing.

All of above can be detected by infra-red imaging.

3. Distribution Boards and final sub-circuits

Prior to 2007, the accepted way of protecting circuits to power points and lights, was to utilise standard circuit breakers in an appropriate distribution board. These circuit breakers are rated at, usually, 10 or 20 amperes, meaning that they will not disconnect a faulty circuit until the load exceeds this value.

RCCB and/or RCBO (see below for description), protection has been mandatory, since 2007 in all Australian and New Zealand new installations, are required under AS/NZS3000.2007 wiring rules (PNG standard for wiring is PNGS1022 and it refers back to the current AS/NZS3000 standard).

This requirement is also supposed to apply to all new electrical installations in PNG. Unfortunately, probably due to manpower problems, PNG Power has not been enforcing the regulation pertaining to RCCB/RCBO installations.

What are RCD's, RCCB's and RCBO's?

These are devices originally designed for personal safety and protection against electric shock. For your information we explain the various devices.

An RCD (Residual Current Device): Is a device, which is designed to open an electrical circuit when there is a differential between the incoming, (line), current, and the return (neutral), current. If a differential exists, it is usually a result of current taking another path, i.e. through a person or an earth fault. When this differential exceeds a pre-set amount, (usually 30 milliamps or 0.030Amps for personal safety), the device open circuits and removes the power source back at the distribution board where the RCD is fitted. There are two principal types of device:

Advice on how to protect your property (cont)

- RCCB's (Residual Current Circuit Breaker): This device is basically a combination of a switch and an RCD. It will <u>ONLY</u> trip when there is a leakage or earth fault event. It <u>WILL NOT</u> trip in the event of overcurrent.
- RCBO's (Residual Current Circuit Breaker with Overload Protection): This device provides <u>BOTH</u> over current <u>AND</u> RCD protection. One device taking the place of a standard circuit breaker, as well as functioning as a RCD.
- Under AS/NZS 3000, until 2007, RCD's were only required to protect standard power point circuits. People
 were protected against electric shock from faulty appliances and hand held portable tools etc. They proved to
 be so successful, the wiring rules now require that they now be fitted to lighting circuits and most electrical
 circuits in all installations.

Apart from their proven ability to save lives, these devices have another extremely useful side effect, being for fire protection. Following are a several scenarios applicable to PNG.

- A rat in the ceiling tries to eat, or bites, an electrically energised cable. The RCBO will probably save the rat,
 (for those that care), it will also automatically disconnect the supply at the switchboard (or wherever the RCBO
 is fitted). With the power disconnected, no bare conductor is left to create a spark and therefore start a fire. A
 normal circuit breaker will not necessarily trip in this situation (until the fault current exceeds the rated value
 of the circuit breaker, but an RCBO most certainly will).
- An employee boils a jug of water and forgets about it. The jug cut-off switch does not operate and the jug boils
 dry, with the element still energised. The element overheats and shorts out, creating an earth fault. The RCBO
 protecting that circuit, back in the distribution board, immediately disconnects the circuit when the earth fault
 is created, thus preventing a fire. A normal circuit breaker will probably not trip in this situation until after a
 spark has created a potential fire.

It is our belief that by installing these devices to existing or new distribution boards, the risk of a fire caused by an electrical circuit fault would be reduced by up to 90 to 95%.

Cost of installing RCBO's

Every installation is different, albeit residential, commercial or industrial. Generally, the cost of a RCBO is about 3-6 times the cost of a standard circuit breaker, depending on brand and quality.

Installation <u>MUST</u> only be carried out by personnel trained in these devices, as misconnection will result in no protection being available.

Niugini Electrical Co. is very experienced in the supply and installation of all types of RCD/RCBO's and only utilise top quality equipment. There are cheaper units available, but their quality is questionable, so we only support proven units of known quality.

Papua New Guinea currency may fall another 10 per cent: ANZ

The value of the Papua New Guinea's currency, the kina, is expected to fall as much as ten per cent over the coming year, after stabilising for the last two months, according to Lead Pacific Economist at ANZ Bank, Daniel Wilson.



The PNG kina's five-year progress against the US dollar, showing recent values still well above the long-term average.

As *Business Advantage PNG* reported in early October, the September quarter of 2013 saw PNG's currency, the kina fall sharply in value, largely due to lower exports and sustained imports.

In spite of recent rallies, ANZ's Daniel Wilson says he expects the kina to fall a further 8 to 10 per cent by the end of calendar year 2014, bringing it closer to its long-term average of US\$0.37.

BUSINESS ADVANTAGE ARTICLE OF THE WEEK (Cont)

Strong GDP growth

Singapore-based Wilson told *Business Advantage PNG* he was expecting 'strong GDP growth figures over the next two years, largely driven by income from LNG production.

'However, whether a significant proportion of these foreign currency earnings enter into the market is vet to be determined.'

Wilson says he's concerned that the six-to-nine month time gap between the start of the LNG production and when the income from LNG sales begins may mean PNG continues to have a high current account deficit during 2014.

High current account deficit

In 2013, a high current account deficit of 20% was driven by <u>declines in key commodity prices</u> (30% for gold), <u>disruption of output at the Ok Tedi mine</u>, naturally declining energy and soft commodity exports, amid sustained import demand for both goods and services.

Coupled with easing foreign direct investment, it led to 'a natural disequilibrium' of demand for the Kina and depreciation pressure, Wilson says.

Central bank minority closely

'Further out, if LNG exports do bring significant foreign currency flows onshore,' Wilson says, 'the Bank of Papua New Guinea will likely closely monitor the kina to avoid the 'Dutch Disease', which is a decline in manufacturing competitiveness as a result of strong currency appreciation due to income from natural resources'.

In its September *Quarterly Economic Bulletin*, released in December, the Bank's Governor Loi M Bakani reported the kina had stabilised at US\$0.413 cents in December, after the bank intervened, spending US\$140 million (K352 million) to ensure a measured fall during the September quarter.

'Consequently, the central bank's intervention in the foreign exchange market has eased and international reserve level has stabilised at around US\$2.8 billion (K7.04 billion), which is sufficient for around eight months of total and 13 months of non-mineral import cover,' he said.
